

**Rodney Bent** most recently served as a Senior Advisor in the U.S. Department of State. Previously, he was an Executive Advisor at Booz Allen Hamilton, after serving as Acting Chief Executive Officer, Deputy Chief Executive Officer and Vice President at the Millennium Challenge Corporation (MCC) from 2005 to 2009. In 2007, the Office of Personnel Management in conjunction with a study conducted by the American University recognized MCC as one of the best small agencies to work for in the Federal government.

Before joining the MCC, he was a professional staff member at the House Appropriations Committee. From 2003 to 2004 he served as the Senior Advisor to the Iraqi Ministry of Finance and the Iraqi Ministry of Planning for the Coalition Provisional Authority (C.P.A.) in Baghdad, Iraq. For his work in Iraq, he was awarded the Secretary of Defense Medal for Exceptional Public Service.

Mr. Bent spent 20 years at the U.S. Office of Management and Budget, where his final position was Deputy Associate Director for the International Affairs Division. Mr. Bent has also held positions at Bankers Trust Company and at the U.S. Department of the Treasury.

As a member of the Senior Executive Service, he was awarded a Presidential Rank Award as a Distinguished Executive in 2001 and a Presidential Rank Award as a Meritorious Executive in 1997.

He received an M.B.A. from Cornell University, an M.A. from the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy, and an A.B. in History from Cornell University.
